

MINOR	Definition
Defiance/Insubordination/Non-compliance	<ul><li>Talking Back</li><li>Failure to follow directions</li></ul>
Disrespect	<ul> <li>Insulting another student in class (first offense)</li> <li>Dismissive messages to adults or students (i.e. ignoring)</li> </ul>
Disruption	<ul> <li>Yelling out in class</li> <li>Side conversations during instruction</li> <li>Random noises (students without accommodations)</li> </ul>
Dress Code	<ul> <li>Students wear clothing that is easily correctable and/or not distracting to the classroom environment (i.e. sagging pants, small holes in pants, bedroom slippers, leggings/jeggings, fingertip test)</li> </ul>
Inappropriate Language	<ul> <li>Inappropriate language with another student (i.e. profanity, derogatory/demeaning language)</li> <li>Mutual conflict</li> <li>One child towards another (see administrator for suspected bullying)</li> </ul>
Property Misuse	<ul> <li>Taking another students belongings</li> <li>Throwing materials</li> <li>Minor vandalism (i.e. writing on desks/walls/lockers)</li> </ul>
Tardy	<ul> <li>Student arrives more than 5 minutes late after being released to/from connections (**Teachers please notate if students are released late)</li> <li>6 or more tardies; see administrator</li> </ul>
Technology Violation	<ul> <li>Misuse of cell phones/devices</li> <li>Off task on electronic devices during instructional time</li> </ul>

Use/Possession of Weapons

Behavior	Definition		
Arson	Student plans and/or participates in malicious burning of property.		
Bomb Threat/False Alarm	Student delivers a message of possible explosive materials being on-campus, near campus, as pending explosion.		
Bullying	The delivery of direct or technology-based messages that involve intimidation, teasing, tauntit threats, or name-calling.		
Disrespect	Student delivers socially rude or dismissive messages to adults, faculty and staff		
Disruption	Student engages in on-going behavior causing an interruption in a class or activity. Disruption sustained loud talk, yelling, or screaming; noise with materials; horseplay or roughhousing; as sustained out-of-seat behavior.		
Dress Code Violation	Student wears clothing that inappropriately exposes parts of the body.		
Fighting	Student is involved in mutual participation in an incident involving physical violence		
Forgery/Theft/Plagiarism	Student is in possession of, having passed on, or being responsible for removing someone els property or has signed a person's name without that person's permission.		
Gang Affiliation Display	Student uses gesture, dress, and/or speech to display affiliation with a gang		
Harassment	The delivery of disrespectful messages in any format related to gender, ethnicity, sex, race, redisability, physical features, or other protected class.		
Inappropriate Display of Affection	Student engages in inappropriate, consensual (as defined by school) verbal and/or physical g contact, of a sexual nature to another student/adult.		
Inappropriate Location/Out of Bound Area -	Student is in an area that is outside of school boundaries (as defined by school) Being caught campus during school hours.		
Physical Aggression	Student engages in actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur (e.g., hi punching, hitting with an object, kicking, hair pulling, scratching, etc.).		
Property Damage/Vandalism	Student participates in an activity that results in destruction or disfigurement of property		
Technology Violation	Student sends threatening/inappropriate messages, pictures and/or videos using electronic communication devices or the internet/intranet at any time.		
Use/Possession of Alcohol	Student is in possession of or is using alcohol.		
Use/Possession of Combustibles	Student is/was in possession of substances/objects readily capable of causing bodily harm an property damage (matches, lighters, firecrackers, gasoline, and lighter fluid).		
Use/Possession of Drugs	Student is in possession of or is using illegal drugs/substances or imitations.		
Use/Possession of Tobacco	Student is in possession of or is using tobacco


