SPLOST IV is still ongoing

SPLOST V are overbudget – sprinklers are up for elimination...this doesn't address student safety but building safety so refocusing. Idlewood – Security fencing is staying. Livsey has HVAC and plumbing. Midvale: High schools scheduled for artificial turf...those are being postponed. This can be funded by the GO Bond to be voted on in March with a project list.

Redistricting: Cascading redistricting is not being proposed by the County at this time, but this would significantly impact the Tucker cluster if it were proposed.

Moving the magnet from Chamblee is being proposed.

SPLOST IV k-12 arts school. There is going to be a hearing to be decided between separate programs, new building or stick to combining at Avondale Middle. In order to take it off SPOST IV then it needs to be declared infeasible. AIC Thursday night.
